# Pupil Achievement

Some of you will have noticed that our 2024 pupil outcomes have been published on our school website. You can find them, along with a useful commentary at https:// www.blackboys.e-sussex.sch.uk/ school-data/

It is well worth a look. We achieved our highest Reception data for some time last year, along with impressive performances in the phonics screen resits, Year 4 multiplication check and Year 6 SATS. Our Year 6 SATS results in particular are some of the strongest results in East Sussex and show that Blackboys pupils leave ready for the next stage in their education. # <u>Attendance</u>

One of the reasons our school results are so strong is because we have high attendance here at Blackboys.

We expect children to be in school every day and that trips and visits take place in the 13 weeks school holidays each year or at weekends. Should there be a time when your child will not be in school and is not ill, a withdrawal from learning application must be made on the correct paperwork which can be obtained from the school office. If a child is off school without due justification or illness, they will be marked down as an unauthorised absence. As many parents will be aware, attendance is a countrywide issue. Legislation has recently been altered, so the school will now be issuing penalty notices if a child misses 5 school days (10 sessions) within 10 schools weeks with one of. or a combination of, the following registration codes..... G: pupil absent without leave for the purpose of a holiday; O: no other attendance of pupil registration applies (ie: we have no information about where that pupil is!); or U: pupil attended after the taking of the register ended but before the end of the session. Penalty notices have also now increased in cost to £80 if paid promptly. Please be aware that the school does not benefit financially from the issuing of fines, it is done to encourage the correct attendance.

We are pleased that at Blackboys the vast majority of parents/carers encourage excellent attendance and work in partnership with the school to achieve this.

# Term 1 24/25 Charity

Last term's charity was Children with Cancer, Hailsham and we are delighted that we raised and sent £232.80 to them.
