It is with great sadness that we have to report that Class 4 Teaching Assistant Mrs Vance has left Blackboys School after being granted ill health retirement. Mrs Vance has been away from school for nearly a year and despite the best efforts of medical staff, is not in a position to return following wrist surgery in the Spring of 2024. Mrs Vance has been a much loved member of our team since September 2001 and joined us

for Gold Book Assembly today where the classes presented her with cards together with a gift from the staff. We will now be advertising for a permanent member of staff to join our team and I will keep parents/carers updated with this.

Parent/Carer Volunteer lifts.

We are always grateful of offers of lifts from parents/carers to and from events such as Young at Heart and sporting fixtures. In fact in some cases our pupils would not be able to participate without them.

We have recently re-viewed the policy which includes parents/carers who volunteer driving the pupils in their cars. In addition to holding a copy of your car insurance and driving licence, we shall also be adding the above QR code to correspondence which will enable the volunteer to complete a check which confirms they have no driving offences. Federation policy also states that anyone with over 6 points showing on their licence will be unable to assist with pupil lifts. We know you will agree that the introduction of this new process will keep our children as safe as possible.

Cancelled After School Art Club Due to staff training there will be NO after school Art Club taking place on Tuesdays 28th January and 04th February 2025. Art club will return for Tuesday 11th February.

Spring Term Parent Consultations

As per the letter sent home earlier this week, this term will see our Spring Term Parent Consultations taking place. Each Parents/Carer will be offered the opportunity to meet with their child's class teacher. To secure your appointment please refer to the letter sent out.

Due to the consultation evening, please remember there will be NO after school football club taking place on Monday 10th February. All other clubs as well as wrap around care continue to take place.

Wrap Around Care

We are thrilled that our wrap around care provision continues to be well used by Parents/Carers. Currently, most days we are at capacity for After School Club and this has been the case for most of this term. Breakfast Club is also becoming increasingly popular.

We have to therefore be strict on the 24 hours notice we require when trying to book in to the club. It may be we will be unable to take same day bookings and there may be increasing occasions when there will be no available space.

Please also remember should you not require a place at a wrap around care session to cancel your child's booking ASAP. This will allow us to offer the place to someone who needs it. We reserve the right to charge for bookings which aren't cancelled.

Our best advice is to book places as far in advance as possible. We would also like to remind parents that After School Club is primarily to support parents who need childcare for work or training. Wrap around care is not a lifestyle choice or a playdate provider.


